and the life † of the world to come. Amen.

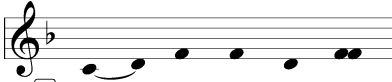
Prayer of the Church

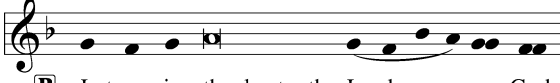

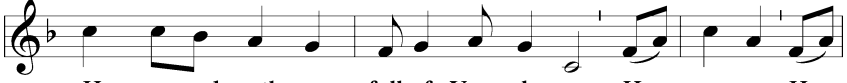

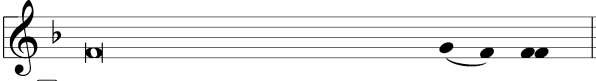
The Words of Our Lord



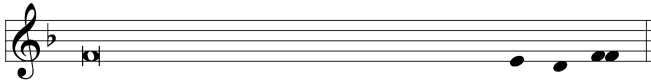

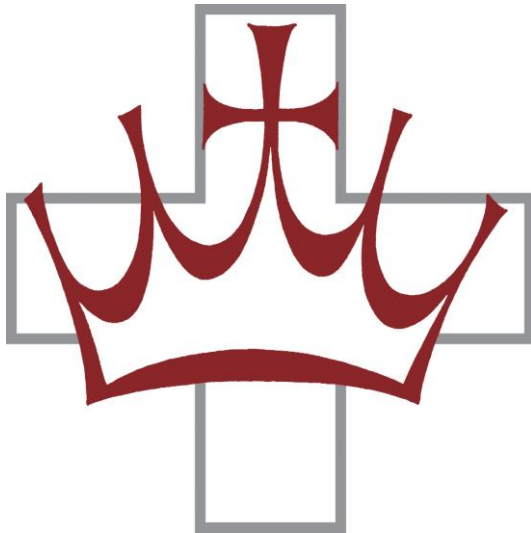
