## Remembrance of Baptism

*Romans 6:3–5*

- P** In Holy Baptism, Mark was clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all his sin. St. Paul says: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?"
